



Nestle-Cameroun Chief Executive, Bruno Olierhok, said the company would begin construction in August. The factory will have the capacity to grind 20,000 tons of beans, Olierhok told state radio, *CRTV*.

The processed coffee will initially be marketed domestically, but the company will eventually supply what it described as a growing coffee market in the region.

*“Nestle wants to put affordable coffee within the reach of Cameroonian consumers and create jobs,”* Olierhok said.

This factory will add to the Union Centrale des Sociétés Coopératives Agricoles de l'Ouest (UCCAO CAMEROUN) owned factory west of the country.
